

Bicycle Helmets





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A reminder that we **strongly recommend** that children who **cycle** or **scoot** to school wear a **helmet**. One of our children suffered a **serious head injury** after a scooter fall at home last year and we would hate something similar to happen to anyone else. It is great to see so many children still **cycling** and **scooting** to school but want to ensure that they do so safely.

Harvest Collection - Friday 20th October

This year we are going to collect **food** and **hygiene** items to deliver to our colleagues at the **Cramlington Food Bank** (at the **Hope Centre**) to **support local families**. If you feel that you are able to donate any items, they are currently in need of the following items -

Indian and Chinese sauces, tins of spaghetti or macaroni cheese, tins of minced beef/beef bolognaise, tins of chicken curry, tins of tuna/sardines, tins of vegetables/red kidney beans/potatoes, tins of fruit, bottles of fruit squash, long life milk, tea, coffee, sugar, instant mash, tins of custard/rice, instant custard, gravy granules, jellies, sponge puddings, jam, pot noodles, cup a soups, angel delight, porridge, crackers, toothbrushes and toothpaste, hand wash, soap powder, toilet rolls, small bottles of washing up liquid, sanitary items (tampons and towels), deodorant, soap, shampoo, conditioner, shower gel and shaving gel.

They politely let us know that they **do not need**: baked beans, pasta, tinned soup or tinned tomatoes. Thank you.

Fidget Toys

We have noticed that an increasing number of children are bringing **fidget toys** into school from home. We realise that, for some children, a 'fidget toy' has **huge benefits** and they can enable them to **access the curriculum** more **successfully**. However, we ask that children **do not bring** in their own fidget toys from home. We have a range of **sensory equipment** that children can use whilst in school that can be organised with **discussion with their class** teachers.

Halloween Raffle

A reminder that we will be holding a Halloween raffle on **Monday 23rd October** to raise money for **school funds. A strip of raffle tickets** will be sent home with children on **Friday 6th October.** Tickets are **£1 each** or a strip can be bought for **£5**. TTRS

A quick update on some of the fantastic work going on in **Year Four** on **Times Table Rockstars**. The average score for the **weekly soundcheck** has gone up from **7.7 correct answers** out of 25 to **10.4 correct answers**! The ultimate aim is for all children to reach

The image on the left shows how quickly children were able to answer times table questions at the start of term. The image on the right shows where the class, on average, is working now. Although it is subtle, you can already see more greens (quick





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answers) than reds (slower answer speeds). Keep working on this at home to help your child to improve their quick recall of times table facts.
