June SMSC Theme - Reflection

We believe giving children time to reflect on their experiences, work and marking (verbal and written) is critical to them making the most from their learning experiences. This months' theme reiterates the importance of reflection. The American psychologist and educational reformer John Dewey said: "We do not learn from experience ... we learn from reflecting on experience."

Children will learn;

- exercises and activities that aide reflection and time for thought,
- to reflect and comment on their own work and experiences in an effective way that helps them progress,
- to understand the importance of reflection and thinking time to aid good decision making in their everyday lives for example, at school, at the beach and when play,
- to appreciate reflection as a means to improvement.

"Reflection is part of learning and thinking. We reflect in order to learn something, or we learn as a result of reflecting, and the term 'reflective learning' emphasises the intention to learn from current or prior experience" (Moon 2004).

COVID Update

Please continue to observe the strict drop off and collection arrangements, and ensure sensible personal distancing and mask wearing on site.
