Robinwood 2024

In March, we sent out a letter to our current Year 5 parents ahead of running Robinwood in January 2024 when children will be in Year 6. We have determined that there is sufficient interest to go ahead with the trip which we're all looking forward to. To secure your child's place, we will ask for a £20 deposit by Friday 23rd June. The full cost of the trip to you is £140. We have subsidised a significant proportion of the trip to make it more affordable and we have also deliberately set up a payment plan to spread the cost over several months. Please note, the payment plan is not yet set up but will go live after the half-term break.

INSET Days

A further reminder that **Monday 26th June** will be an **INSET Day** so school will be closed. INSET Days for the **2023-24 academic year** will be **as follows:**
