We advocate a 'little and often' approach to TTRS and spending 5-10 minutes every other day can make a massive difference to times **table knowledge**, **confidence** and ability to **calculate quickly** and **proficiently**. We will keep celebrating TTRS in school and would encourage you to access it at home where you can.

We reluctantly had to postpone our **Year 4** trip to **Holy Island** again due to poor weather.
