Marvellous Makers

Northumberland Libraries will be launching 'Marvellous Makers', this year's Summer Reading Challenge, on Saturday 6th July. Some of you will hopefully have seen the invitations which went out yesterday with our Nursery, Reception, Year One and Year Two children. We are lucky to have an excellent library on our doorstep and we'd encourage you to join if you haven't done so already. We talk a lot about reading for pleasure and we hope to instil that love in our children and families.



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Lateness

We have had an increasing number of children coming to school just after the doors close at **08:50**. It is really important to ensure that your child is **in school**, **on time**, every day. We ask that children are **lined up** outside their doors on the main yard ready to come in at **08:45** so we can start our learning promptly. We have **basic skills activities** (including **spelling**, **handwriting**, **reading**, **TTRS** and **Emile**) all set up **on entry** to the classroom. Just five minutes of lost learning each day amounts to **25 minutes per week**. Over the course of the year this is over **16 hours** which is roughly four full days of lesson time!

Transition Morning

Yesterday we had our **transition morning** in school. It was a great opportunity for **staff** and **children** to begin to get to know each other ahead of **September**. Naturally, staff will be providing a **detailed handover** for your child's **new teachers** so they're able to **hit the ground running** in the new year.

Attendance

We have had a better week this week with attendance. Year Six recorded the highest attendance this week with 97.42% which is particularly important with all of the transition events going on. Well done also to Reception and Year Five for hitting our overall target of 96%. Fingers crossed we have a really good last couple of weeks of the school year.
