

Sport Premium Funding 2022-2023

At Beaconhill Community Primary school, PE and sport premium funding is being used to secure improvements in the following areas.

Key indicator 1: Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.

As a beach school, we take children out on visits to the beach regularly as part of the curriculum. The visits are designed to keep the children active and always include an element of physical learning. We used some of the Sports premium money this year to subsidise some of our beach visits as these visits really support us to ensure that the children are outdoors and physically active in a variety of different ways. £2500

Supporting our children to be more active at playtimes continues to be a real priority at Beaconhill. To ensure that the children are offered activities at lunchtime that will engage them and teach them key skills relating to being physically active, team work and cooperation, we use some of our SSP money to cover the costs of an additional lunchtime supervisor who facilitates the above. £3500

This year some of the larger PE equipment needed to be replaced i.e. the gymnastics mats large and small and the basketball nets outside. We use this equipment a lot in our coverage of the PE curriculum so some of our money was used to go towards renewing them. £550

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

This year some of our KS2 girls entered a girls football tournament. Following in the footsteps of The England ladies team our girls showed perseverance, determination and team spirit during their matches. As we hope to continue this in the years to come, we used some of our money to buy kit for the girls i.e. strips, boots and shin pads. £500

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils. £700

As a reward for a successful school year, we hired an inflatable obstacle course to visit school. The course was accessible for all of our children from Nursery up to Year 6. It was such a positive experience for all of the children who enjoyed some class competitions when it was their turn.

Enrichment Days £1100

Some of our funding this year went towards Enrichment days for the children. One of the days was a workshop that allowed our youngest children to try their hand at circus skills. The session built on skills taught in the PE curriculum this year of balance, agility and co-ordination.

The older children took part in Archery. This was a completely new experience to the majority of children in school. The children worked well in their teams and enjoyed the competition that this sport brought.
