Head Lice

We have had a couple of cases of **head lice** in school this week. Head lice and nits are **very common** in young children and their families and are picked up by **head-to-head** contact. Staff are not able to search children's hair for live lice, but if any are spotted we will **inform parents immediately** so that treatment can be started at once. Please remember to check and treat the whole family to avoid further spread and again after four to seven days to catch any newly hatched lice.

A good website to visit is <u>www.headlice.org</u> which has a useful section of **frequently asked questions**. We also ask that **long hair** is tied back for **health and safety reasons** and to avoid the potential of head lice to spread.

Parking

School Day

A reminder that the school day starts at 08:45 for all children in Years One to Six. We expect children to be lined up outside their classroom doors by 08:45 ready to go straight in and start their learning. For children in Years Four, Five and Six who make their own way to school, we ask that they arrive no earlier than 08:30. It's great that some children are so keen to get to school but I've seen some children on the yard just after 08:00. As we move into the winter months, it is too dark and cold for children to be on the yard so early so please help us to ensure your children don't set off too early.

Asda Cashpot

An update from our Asda Cashpot. At last count, you'd helped us accumulate over £300 which will go towards school funds. There are still several weeks for the cashpot to add up. If you don't already know, Asda is running an initiative called 'Cashpot for Schools' which could benefit us. I have noticed that some of our children are using their **mobile phones** on the yard just **before** or **after** school. We ask that all children keep their phones **out of sight** when they enter the **school grounds** - either in their **pocket** or

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bag. This is for safeguarding purposes. I have reminded children of this expectation this week but would really appreciate it if you could reinforce this at home.
