Reading

At the start of this new school year, we would like to remind all parents that children in **Year One**, **Year Two** and **Year Three** have access to Collins Big Cat books in their online library. This library consists of books that children should be able to read using their phonics skills which we develop in school. The more your child reads, the more fluent they will become. Children in **Reception** will gain access to their library before Christmas so keep an eye out for login details after half term. Mrs Carrick and I will be monitoring engagement with reading throughout the year and those children who read regularly will receive certificates and prizes. This weekend, it would be extremely helpful if you logged into your child's account to access their library. Attendance and Lateness

Well done to Year 2 for winning the attendance cup for the week commencing 26th September. Miss Wilkinson's class recorded an impressive 97% attendance overall. Attendance across school has started to decrease over the last couple of weeks. I appreciate that COVID and some seasonal sickness bugs have been going around but it is vitally important that our attendance picks up. We aim for attendance across the year to be at least 95%. If attendance consistently falls below this, referrals can ultimately be made to the Education Welfare Officer. We have also noted that more children are coming into school after 09:00am. If your child is late, **you must drop them into school to sign them in**. Key learning takes place at the start of the day and children need to be in on time, ready to learn. Thank you.
