#### TTRS 'Battle of the Bands'

A huge well done to Year Four who won the 'Battle of the Bands' event across Key Stage Two. Collectively, they earned well over 70,000 coins which is incredible! It is worth noting the amazing progress made by Year Four with their weekly 'soundcheck'. In September, the class recorded an average score of 6/25 on their mixed multiplication and division questions. This week, the average score was 19/25! 15 children recorded scores of 20 or



above, nine of which were 25/25! Year 4 pupils across the country will complete a **25 question multiplication** assessment in June so we've still got lots of time to keep pushing instant recall of times table facts. The more you can do at home to support the better so please encourage your child to access TTRS frequently.

#### **Discos**

A reminder that all disco tickets for next week need to be purchased by the end of day today. **Tickets** are available to buy on our **online** payment system. **£2.50** entry includes **crisps**, **sweets** and a **drink**. The discos will start at **3:15pm** and run until **4:15pm**. Children should **bring their disco clothes to school in a <u>bag</u> on the morning of their disco to change into at the end of the school day.**
