KS1 Assessments

Over the next two weeks, children in **Year Two** will be completing assessments in **Reading** and **Maths**. These papers are delivered to children in Year Two across the country in **May each year**. The papers are designed to contribute towards **teacher judgement** of the level at which children are working and we make sure that children understand that they are nothing to worry about. Please note that we make a **deliberate point** of not using the terms '**SATs**' or '**tests**' with the children so as not to build up pressure. The assessments are not strictly timed and do not generate a 'level' in the same way that Key Stage 2 SATs do. **Miss Wilkinson** and the **Year Two team** know our children far better than any standalone assessment and have been working hard since September to identify the strengths and next steps for every child in the class. Children have absolutely nothing to worry about and all we ask of them is to try their very best - which they always do!

TTRS

Our Year 4 children have **two extra special** TTRS 'battles' lined up for the next two weeks against classes in my previous school, **King Edward Primary School**. I have been in touch with former colleagues in the two Year 4 classes there and we have arranged for the 'Routledge Derby' to take place.
