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## **World Book Day**

### Reading

We have noticed recently that some children are not reading regularly to an adult at home. At Beaconhill, we recognise the importance of regular reading both at school and at home. The expectation is that children should read with an adult at home at least once a week and, ideally, even more often. A comment should then be written into reading records. In your child's reading record, there is an information sheet detailing the things you may wish to comment on. Children bring a reading book home every Tuesday which is then due back the following Monday. Reading regularly with your child has a massive benefit in terms of progress in reading and writing.

## **Family Hub Workshops**

One of our contacts at the **Family Hub** have asked us to let you know about the **parenting drop in service** running from the **Community House** in **Eastlea estate**. It's held weekly on a **Wednesday** and for each session, a family worker is there to provide parenting advice. There is no need to book a slot for each session so those who are interested can just pop in at their convenience. Further information will follow after half-term.

#### **Long Hair**

Could we politely remind you that **long hair** (below shoulder length) should be tied up when children are in school. This is important from a **health and safety** point of view in PE lessons and also to ensure it doesn't obscure their view when completing work in the classroom.

#### **Dinners**

Just a reminder that as a school we **do not offer credit** on **school dinners**. School dinners must be **paid for in advance** and no later than the day before. If you require a school lunch without having paid for it in advance, you can pay cash via the school office.

#### **Beach**

This week, **Year Four** have visited the beach to produce **insect themed artwork**. Children used natural materials that they were able to scavenge to produce large representations of insects. The photographs on Facebook look great and I'd encourage you to have a look! During the second half of the week, **Year Three** have been to **Hauxley** to produce some of their own cave art.
