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

### **Internet Safety**

Hopefully you will have seen the information sheet which we shared out yesterday relating to the 'Omegle' website. The site pairs people up with strangers online for live text or video chats. The site has an age restriction of 18+ but has been popularised by TikTok. The site poses a significant risk to children of exposure of inappropriate language, sexual content and grooming. As far as I am aware, none of our children have accessed the site but other schools across the region have had issues with it so please remain vigilant.



### **Attendance**

Well done to Mr Shepherd's class for their fantastic attendance in the last week of the Spring term. Year One recorded 97.67% attendance for the week commencing 27th March. Miss Wilkinson's class were pipped into second place but recorded an impressive overall attendance of 97.41%.
